1 Where were you in February of 1979? Incarcerated at Dauphin County Prison. 3 Were you aware of the fact that one James Hugney was 4 being tried on the charge of murder? 5 No, not at the time. Not until after I was told 6 that Harry Whitman was in a separate part of the prison because 7 he testified against James Hugney. Who told you that? 9 One of the people that were in the cell block that 10 knew Harry Whitman. I happened to ask why he was up front, 11 and they told me all about Jim Hugney being tried for murder 12 and that Harry was testifying. 13 I never met Jim before. I didn't know him or 14 anything like that. 15 When did you meet Jim? 16 Well, I told this person about a deal that 17 Harry Whitman had taken. I don't remember the guy's name that 18 I was talking to. 19 One of the inmates? 20 Right, but I told him about a deal that Harry was 21 supposedly -- well, was making with the DA's office and that he 22 wasn't really -- that, you know, he was lying in his testimony. 23 Let me stop you there. 24 How did you know that he was making a deal and that 25 he was lying in his testimony?

Through a telephone conversation that he had with 1 2 Linda Lane. When did that conversation take place? 3 4 When Harry first went back to jail. Do you remember what month that was? 0 5 A No, January possibly. Where did that conversation take place, the phone 8 conversation? I believe it was Camp Hill, from White Hill to 620 North Third Street, Hotline Rentals. Was that where you were at the time? 11 Q 12 Α Yes. Was Harry Whitman at 620 or was Linda --13 A Linda Lane was at 620 North Third, and Harry Whitman 14 was in White Hill. 15 16 How do you know that was Harry Whitman that was on 17 the phone? Because I picked up the phone. 18 19 There was like -- we probably have about ten lines that come into the office. The phones are always answered, 20 and I happened to pick up the phone.
